QUALITY ASSURANCE



At Total Project Australia, quality is embedded in every step of our construction process—from early planning to final delivery. We have implemented a structured Quality Management System (QMS) designed to ensure that every project meets or exceeds client expectations, statutory requirements, and applicable standards.

Our system includes:

- Pre-construction quality reviews to identify design risks, buildability issues, and interface challenges early
- Project-specific Inspection and Test Plans (ITPs) to guide quality checks at critical hold points throughout delivery
- Subcontractor quality compliance reviews as part of onboarding and during active works
- Daily site inspections and ongoing verification processes by site supervisors and project managers
- Issue tracking via non-conformance reports (NCRs) and immediate corrective actions when required

We maintain open communication channels with clients, consultants, and subcontractors to address quality concerns early and transparently. Our reporting structure ensures accountability and traceability of all QA processes.

To drive continuous improvement, we conduct post-project reviews, track lessons learned, and regularly update our QA documentation and site practices based on feedback and audit results.

SAFETY

We utilise the HazardCo WHS platform to manage all safety requirements onsite. This system allows for real-time reporting, daily risk assessments, and centralised safety documentation, ensuring full compliance with legislative requirements and industry best practice.

Subcontractor compliance is closely monitored from the start. All subcontractors must complete a thorough pre-qualification process, including the submission of SWMS, insurances, and licences before arriving onsite. Once on site, they are inducted through HazardCo and required to follow our safety protocols without exception.

We conduct regular toolbox talks, safety audits, and collaborative reviews to promote open communication, identify risks early, and ensure our safety standards remain proactive and effective.


